If you eat trout, chances are the fish on your plate started at the Cedar Crest hatchery, where 95% of Ontario's trout fry begin their lives. Sister and brother Arlen and RJ Taylor are second-generation aquaculturalists who work with fresh water, local skilled labour and the internet of things to raise over 6,000,000 trout fry a year.
