Eclipses, 1906.

In the year 1906 there will be five eclipses, three of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. A total eclipse of the Moon February 9th, visible in N. America.

II. A partial eclipse of the Sun February 22nd, invisible.

III. A partial eclipse of the Sun July 20th and 21st, invisible.

IV. A partial eclipse of the Moon August 4th, beginning visible in the west of N. America.

V. A partial eclipse of the Sun August 19th, invisible.

Morning and Evening Stars.

VENUS will be a morning star to Feb. 14th, an evening star to Nov. 23rd, afterwards morning star.

MARS will be an evening star to July 15th, afterwards morning star.

JUPITER will be an evening star to June 10th, a morning star to Dec. 28th.

SATURN will be an evening star to Feb. 24th, a morning star to Sept. 4th, afterwards evening star.

MERCURY may be seen in the morning about Jan. 4th, May 2nd, Aug. 29th, Dec. 18th, and in the evening about Mar. 18th, July 15th and Nov. 9th.

VENUS at greatest brilliancy Oct. 25th.

The SATELLITES of JUPITER are invisible from May 11th to July 10th.
