### **RULES FOR COMPUTING INTEREST.**

The following will be found to be excellent rules for finding the interest on any principal for any number of days. When the principal contains cents, point off four places from the right of the result to express the interest in dollars and cents. When the principal contains dollars only, point off two places.

**Four per Cent.**—Multiply the principal by the number of days to run and divide by 90.

**Five per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 72.

**Six per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 60.

**Seven per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 52.

**Eight per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 45.

**Nine per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 40.

**Ten per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 36.

**Twelve per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 30.

**Fifteen per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 24.

**Eighteen Per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 20.

**Twenty Per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 18.

**Twenty-four per Cent.**—Multiply by number of days and divide by 15.

## POSTAL INFORMATION.

### POST CARDS—

Canada or the United States, 1 cent. Great Britain, Newfoundland, etc., 2 cents. Private post cards—Upon all cards intended for use as private post cards the words "Private Post Card" must be printed or written. Size of card must not exceed 6 inches in length by  $3\frac{1}{2}$  in width.

### LETTERS—

Canada and United States, per oz., 2 cents. Great Britain, Newfoundland, and various other British possessions and protectorates, per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., 2 cents. Registered letters for Canada, United States, Great Britain and Europe, 5 cents in addition to postage.

### BOOKS, CIRCULARS, DOCUMENTS, ETC.—

Canada, United States, Great Britain and all Postal Union countries, per 2 oz., 1 cent. Limit of weight for domestic post, 5 lbs. unless single book, in which case, 10 lbs. will be allowed, size 2 ft. in length and 1 ft. in width or depth, must be open at ends. For foreign post limit of weight 4 lbs.

### NEWSPAPERS—

Less than 1 oz., posted singly,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. Per 4 oz. 1 cent. England, 2 oz., 1 cent.

### PARCEL POST—

The dimensions of a Parcel must not exceed 30 inches in length by 1 foot in width or depth, nor combined length and girth, 6 feet; dimensions of parcel for other than the United Kingdom not to exceed 2 feet in length by 1 in width or depth. A Parcel must not contain any explosive, combustible or dangerous articles.

#### POSTAL INFORMATION.—*Continued.*

All Parcels must be securely and substantially packed and closed. Oils, liquids, etc., can only be forwarded if put up with the same security required in connection with their transmission as samples in the ordinary mails. Fragile articles should be packed with special care. Each Parcel must be plainly directed, and such direction must include the name and full address of the person for whom the Parcel is intended. For each Parcel the sender must fill up a Customs Declaration. On this form the sender will supply an accurate statement of the contents and value of the Parcel, also the address thereof, with signature and place of abode of the sender. The Customs Declaration must be securely affixed by mucilage or paste to the parcel to which it relates. Parcels from the United Kingdom or any other place beyond the Dominion will be liable to Canadian Custom duties, and under existing regulations must be examined for the purpose by an Officer of the Customs *in the presence of the persons addressed*. Rates and limit of weight vary. See Postal Guide, or enquire at Post Office. Prepayment by postage stamp is required in all cases. Parcels must be handed to the Postmaster; in no case should they be dropped into a letter box or other receptacle for mail matter.

#### PATTERNS AND SAMPLES—

Canada, not exceeding 3 lbs. in weight, except samples of tea, which must not exceed 8 ozs. in weight, per 4 oz., 2 cents. Great Britain, limit of 5 lbs. United States, limit of 12 ozs., 1 cent per 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz. Rates and limits of weight vary. See Postal Guide, or enquire at Post-Office.

## MONEY ORDERS—

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by Money Order if possible.

## COMMISSIONS ON MONEY ORDERS—

On money orders drawn by any money order office in Canada on any other money order office in the Dominion, the United States and Newfoundland, the commission is as follows :

No single money order, payable in the Dominion of Canada, the United States or Newfoundland, can be issued for more than \$100; but as many of \$100 each may be given as the remitter requires.

Money orders are issued in Canada, payable in British Possessions, the United States, and other foreign countries, at the rates of commission shown below :

## POSTAL NOTES—

Postal Notes are bought and paid at any Money Order and Postal Note Office. The commission payable is:—For 20c. to 40c., 1 cent; 50c. to \$2.50, 2 cents; \$3 to \$5, 3 cents. Odd cents may be made up by affixing Canadian postage stamps, not exceeding 9 cents, to the face of the Postal Note.

### HELP IN CASE OF ACCIDENTS.

**Drowning.**—1. Loosen clothing, if any. 2. Empty lungs of water by laying body on its stomach and lifting it by the middle so that the head hangs down. Jerk the body a few times. 3. Pull tongue forward, using handkerchief, or pin with string, if necessary. 4. Imitate motion of respiration by alternately compressing and expanding the lower ribs, about twenty times a minute. Alternately raising and lowering the arm from the sides up above the head will stimulate the action of the lungs. Let it be done gently but persistently. 5. Apply warmth and friction to extremities. 6. By holding tongue forward, closing the nostrils and pressing the "Adam's apple" back (so as to close entrance to stomach), direct inflation can be tried. Take a deep breath, and breathe it forcibly into the mouth of patient, compress the chest to expel the air and repeat the operation. 7. Don't GIVE UP! People have been saved after hours of patient, vigorous effort. 8. When breathing begins, get patient into a warm bed, give *warm* drinks, or spirits in teaspoonfuls, fresh air and quiet.

**Burns and Scalds.**—Cover with cooking soda and lay wet cloths over it. Whites of eggs and olive oil. Olive or linseed oil, plain, or mixed with chalk or whiting.

**Sunstroke.**—Loosen clothing. Get patient into shade, and apply ice-cold water to head.

**Mad Dog or Snake Bite.**—Tie cord tight above wound. Suck the wound and cauterize with caustic or white-hot iron at once, or cut out adjoining parts with a sharp knife.

**Venomous Insects' Stings, Etc.**—Apply weak ammonia, oil, salt water, or iodine.

**Cinders in the Eye.**—Roll soft paper up like a lamplighter and wet the tip to remove, or use a medicine dropper to draw it out. Rub the other eye.

## ANTIDOTES FOR POISONS.

FIRST.—Send for a physician.

SECOND.—Induce vomiting by tickling throat with feather or finger; drinking hot water or strong mustard and water. Swallow sweet oil or whites of eggs.

Acids are antidotes for alkalies, and vice versa.

### SPECIAL POISONS AND ANTIDOTES

ACIDS.—Muriatic, Oxalic, Acetic, Sulphuric (Oil of Vitriol), Nitric (Aqua Fortis). Soap suds, magnesia, lime water.

PRUSSIC ACID.—Ammonia in water. Dash water in face.

CARBOLIC ACID.—Flour and water, mucilaginous drinks.

ALKALIES.—Potash, Lye, Hartshorn, Ammonia. Vinegar or lemon juice in water.

ARSENIC.—Rat Poison, Paris Green. Milk, raw eggs, sweet oil, limewater, flour and water.

BUG POISON.—Lead, Saltpetre, Corrosive Sublimate, Sugar of Lead, Blue Vitriol. Whites of eggs, or milk in large doses.

CHLOROFORM.—Chloral, Ether. Dash cold water on head and chest, artificial respiration.

CARBONATE OF SODA.—Copperas, Cobalt. Soap suds and mucilaginous drinks.

IODINE.—Antimony, Tartar Emetic. Starch and water, astringent infusions, strong tea.

MERCURY and its salts.—Whites of eggs, milk, mucilages.

OPIUM.—Morphine, Laudanum, Paregoric, Soothing Powders or Syrups. Strong coffee; keep awake and moving at any cost; hot bath.
