Eclipses, 1903.

In the year 1903 there will be four eclipses, two of the sun and two of the moon.

I. An annular eclipse of the sun, March 29th, invisible, path of annularity situated in Asia, China and the Arctic Ocean.

II. A partial eclipse of the moon, April 11th, partly visible. Moon enters penumbra April 11d. 4h. 26m.; moon enters shadow 5h. 34m.; middle of eclipse 7h. 13m.; moon leaves shadow 8h. 52m.; moon leaves penumbra 10h. 0m.; magnitude of eclipse 0.97; moon's diameter=1.

III. A total eclipse of the sun Sept. 20th, invisible, visible in E. Africa, Indian Ocean and S. Australia.

IV. A partial eclipse of the moon Oct. 6th, invisible.

Morning and Evening Stars.

VENUS will be an evening star to Sept. 17th, then morning star.

MARS is a morning star to March 28th, then evening star to end of year.

JUPITER is an evening star to Feb. 19th, a morning star to Sept. 11th, afterwards evening.

SATURN is an evening star to Jan. 20th, a morning star to July 29th, afterwards evening.

MERCURY may be seen in the morning about Feb. 27th, June 27th and Oct. 18th, and in the evening about Jan. 17th, May 10th and Sept. 7th.

VENUS at its greatest brilliancy Aug. 13th and Oct. 24th.

JUPITER'S SATELLITES are not visible from Jan. 21st until March 19th.
