## POSTAL INFORMATION.

### POST CARDS—

Canada or the United States, 1 cent. Great Britain, Newfoundland, etc., 2 cents. Private post cards—Upon all cards intended for use as private post cards the words "Private Post Card" must be printed or written. Size of card must not exceed 6 inches in length by 3½ in width.

### LETTERS—

Canada, United States and Newfoundland, per oz., 2 cents. Great Britain, per ½ oz., 2 cents. Registered letters for Canada, United States, Great Britain and Europe, 5 cents in addition to postage.

### BOOKS, CIRCULARS, DOCUMENTS, ETC.—

Canada, per 4 oz., 1 cent. United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and Europe, per 2 oz., 1 cent. Limit of weight for domestic post, 5 lbs. unless single book, in which case, 7 lbs. will be allowed, size 2 ft. in length and 1 ft. in width or depth, must be open at ends. For foreign post limit of weight 4 lbs.

### NEWSPAPERS—

Less than 1 oz., posted singly, ½ cent. Per 4 oz. 1 cent. Great Britain and Ireland, 2 oz., 1 cent.

### PARCEL POST—

The charges on parcels to places within the Dominion is 6 cents for 4 oz. or fraction thereof. No letter must be enclosed, if any discovered

the amount paid will be forfeited and the parcel charged at unpaid letter rates. No parcel must exceed 5 lbs. in weight and must be prepaid by stamps. Registration 5 cents additional. Closed parcels may be exchanged with the United Kingdom and Newfoundland and most foreign countries and British Colonies as follows: Size, 2 ft. in length by 1 ft. in width or depth. Parcel must not contain explosive, combustible or dangerous articles or any of a perishable or fragile nature, nor liquids likely to injure other parcels or mail transmissions. For each parcel the sender must fill up a customs declaration, marking on it contents and value, with signature and address of sender attached. The customs declaration must be pasted to the parcel to which it relates. Rates and limits of weight vary (see Postal Guide or inquire at post office). Parcels must be prepaid by stamps and handed to postmaster, and not dropped in the letter box.

#### PATTERNS AND SAMPLES—

Canada, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, except samples of tea, which must not exceed 8 ozs. in weight, per 4 oz., 1 cent. Great Britain, limit of 5 lbs. United States, limit of 8 oz., 2 cents for the first 4 oz. and 1 cent per 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz. additional. Rates and limits of weight vary. See Postal Guide, or enquire at Post-Office.

**MONEY ORDERS—**

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by Money Order if possible.

No single money order, payable in the Dominion of Canada, can be issued for more than \$100; but as many of \$100 each may be given as the remitter requires.

Postal Notes have been placed in the hands of all Money Order Post Offices in Canada. They offer a convenient and safe means of transmitting small sums through the mails, and their use is likely to be widespread as soon as the public become acquainted with the system. Their use is confined to Canada.

The commission payable is:—For 20c. to 40c., 1 cent; 50c. to \$2.50, 2 cents; \$3 to \$5, 3 cents. Odd cents may be made up by affixing postage stamps, not exceeding 9 cents, to the Postal Note.

## HELP IN CASE OF ACCIDENTS.

**Drowning.**—1. Loosen clothing, if any. 2. Empty lungs of water by laying body on its stomach and lifting it by the middle so that the head hangs down. Jerk the body a few times. 3. Pull tongue forward, using handkerchief, or pin with string, if necessary. 4. Imitate motion of respiration by alternately compressing and expanding the lower ribs, about twenty times a minute. Alternately raising and lowering the arm from the sides up above the head will stimulate the action of the lungs. Let it be done gently but persistently. 5. Apply warmth and friction to extremities. 6. By holding tongue forward, closing the nostrils and pressing the "Adam's apple" back (so as to close entrance to stomach), direct inflation can be tried. Take a deep breath, and breathe it forcibly into the mouth of patient, compress the chest to expel the air and repeat the operation. 7. Don't GIVE UP! People have been saved after hours of patient, vigorous effort. 8. When breathing begins, get patient into a warm bed, give *warm* drinks, or spirits in teaspoonfuls, fresh air and quiet.


**Burns and Scalds.**—Cover with cooking soda and lay wet cloths over it. Whites of eggs and olive oil. Olive or linseed oil, plain, or mixed with chalk or whiting.

**Sunstroke.**—Loosen clothing. Get patient into shade, and apply ice-cold water to head.

**Mad Dog or Snake Bite.**—Tie cord tight above wound. Suck the wound and cauterize with caustic or white-hot iron at once, or cut out adjoining parts with a sharp knife.

**Venomous Insects' Stings, Etc.**—Apply weak ammonia, oil, salt water, or iodine.

**Cinders in the Eye.**—Roll soft paper up like a lamplighter and wet the tip to remove, or use a medicine dropped to draw it out. Rub the other eye.





## ANTIDOTES FOR POISONS.

**FIRST.**—Send for a physician.

**SECOND.**—Induce vomiting by tickling throat with feather or finger; drinking hot water or strong mustard and water. Swallow sweet oil or whites of eggs.

Acids are antidotes for alkalies, and vice versa.

## SPECIAL POISONS AND ANTIDOTES

**ACIDS.**—Muriatic, Oxalic, Acetic, Sulphuric (Oil of Vitriol), Nitric (Aqua Fortis). Soap suds, magnesia, lime water.

**PRUSSIC ACID.**—Ammonia in water. Dash water in face.

**CARBOLIC ACID.**—Flour and water, mucilaginous drinks.

**ALKALIES.**—Potash, Lye, Hartshorn, Ammonia. Vinegar or lemon juice in water.

**ARSENIC.**—Rat Poison, Paris Green. Milk, raw eggs, sweet oil, limewater, flour and water.

**BUG POISON.**—Lead, Saltpetre, Corrosive Sublimate, Sugar of Lead, Blue Vitriol. Whites of eggs, or milk in large doses.

**CHLOROFORM.**—Chloral, Ether. Dash cold water on head and chest, artificial respiration.

**CARBONATE OF SODA.**—Copperas, Cobalt. Soap suds and mucilaginous drinks.

**IODINE.**—Antimony, Tartar Emetic. Starch and water, astringent infusions, strong tea.

**MERCURY and its salts.**—Whites of eggs, milk, mucilages.

**OPIUM.**—Morphine, Laudanum, Paregoric, Soothing Powders or Syrups. Strong coffee; keep awake and moving at any cost; hot bath.
