Great Britain and Ireland, by Canadian packet, 5c.
Do. do. by New York do., 5 cents.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

On Letters to any other place in Canada or British North America, 2c.; on Letters for the United States, 5c; on Letters for the United Kingdom, 5c. Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

ON NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada—must be prepaid 1 cent per 4 oz. by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded; less than 1 oz., $\frac{1}{2}$ cent—except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents; such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails. Transient Newspapers to the United Kingdom, 2 cents per 4 oz.—must be prepaid.

PERIODICALS.

To any part of Canada or the United States, 1 cent per 4 ozs., prepaid. To United Kingdom, if Canadian publications, per Canadian packet, 2 cents each, prepaid.

RATES OF POSTAGE—Continued.

PARCEL POST.

Not to exceed 5 lbs., to any part of Canada, 4 ozs. 6 cts. ; 5 cts. additional if registered.

BOOKS, CIRCULARS, PAMPHLETS, ETC.

Between any place in Canada, and to Newfoundland, 1 cent per 4 ozs., prepaid.

Book packets to the United Kingdom or the United States, 1 cent per 2 oz.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Money Order Offices throughout the Dominion also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland, and Scotland, and the Channel Islands, for any sum up to £10 sterling; and grant as many orders for £10 sterling each as may be needed to make up the amount to be remitted. The terms are: On Orders up to £2, 10 cents, and 10 cents on each additional £2,

MONEY ORDERS IN CANADA.

All the Money Order Offices of Canada are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many Orders of \$100 each as the applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz.: On Orders up to \$4, 2c.; up to \$10, 5c. Over \$10 and up to \$20, 10c.; over \$20 and up to \$40, 20c.; over \$40 and up to \$60, 30c.; over \$60 and up to \$80, 40c.; over \$80 and up to \$100, 50c.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of commission charged on Money Orders on the United States is: For any sum not exceeding \$10, 10 cents; for each additional \$10, 10 cents. Money Orders issued in Canada on the United States are converted into and payable at their value in United States currency.

LAW TERMS.

Hilary, 1st Monday in February to Saturday of ensuing week.

Easter, 3rd Monday in May to Saturday of 2nd week thereafter.

Trinity, 1st Monday in August after 21st of said month to the Saturday of the following week.

Michaelmas, 3rd Monday in November to Saturday of 2nd week thereafter.

Assizes—Twice in each year in every county or union of counties in Ontario, between Hilary and Easter Terms, and between the 21st of August and Michaelmas Term. In the County of York there are two additional Courts, one in the vacation between Easter Term and the 1st of July, and the other in the vacation between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms; and in the County of Wentworth there is one additional, between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms.

County Courts—Four times in each year, commencing respectively on the first Monday in the months of January, April, July, and October, and ending on Saturday of the same week.

Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

II.—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, January 16-17, 1889.

III.—An annular Eclipse of the Sun, June 28, 1889. Invisible in Canada.

IV.—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, July 12, 1889. Invisible in Canada.

V.—A total Eclipse of the Sun, December 22, 1889. Invisible in Canada.

A great flood occurred in Pennsylvania May 31-1889 whereby several towns were destroyed and the greater part of the city of Johnstown. The dam to a small lake broke away caused by the incessant rains. A large gang of men worked among the debris at the bridge in Johnstown for two weeks and the last day there were still 19 bodies taken out then they gave up and set it on fire - about 2000 lives lost altogether (supposed)
