COLORADO—Jan. 1, Feb. 22, May 30, July 4, 1st Monday in Sept., Thanksgiving, Dec. 25, Arbor Day, general election.

CONNECTICUT—Jan. 1, Feb. 22, Fast day, May 30, July 4, 1st Monday in Sept., Lincoln's day in Oct. (15), Thanksgiving, Dec. 25.
